PARTNERSHIP WITH SOLVE CLIMATE 2030

We are overjoyed to announce that GCEI and Solve Climate 2030 have sealed a partnership that includes all our schools and future ones.

Solve Climate By 2030 is a coordinated climate education initiative across OSUN and beyond. It organizes educators to dedicate the first Wednesday of April each year during the 2020s as a day for global, coordinated education on climate solutions. The project creates and promotes templates for educational initiatives, highlighting ambitious local and regional climate solutions, and ways in which students and other citizens can engage with communities to support these solutions. In addition, Solve Climate is preparing an online practicum course, Social Media for Climate Activism, for students at all OSUN institutions. The course will explore the theory and practice of social media, with student projects undertaken in support of building engagement with Solve Climate.


FUNDRAISING PACKAGE

PREPARATION FOR COHORT II

At GCEI we are very excited about preparing Cohort II that will begin in September 2024. Our goal is to unite 10 schools distributed in the USA, Africa, Europe, South America, and Asia and start this path with a new group of students to empower them to be catalysts for change.

So far, two schools have confirmed their decision to join our program: Vallis Longus (Portugal), and Tumaini Open School (Tanzania). And we are currently in conversations with other schools in the US, India, Colombia and Kenia to enlarge our GCEI global network. As part of this process, the GCEI team has created a Recruitment Package that contains a description of the program's pedagogical process, the role of the School Advisor and the students, the types of meetings that take place throughout the year, among others. Likewise, a procedure has been developed to recruit schools that will allow for greater clarity and efficiency.
